Already have the Naval Heroes of Columbia achieved for themselves immortal glory; and a new opportunity is now offered to enter your names on the roll of Fame.— You are invited to rank yourselves under the standard of your country, in a service, which will not merely distinguish, but reward you.

A Rendezvous for the *Marine Service* is now opened at the house of Landlord *Perez Trazo, Fell's Point Market, No. 2*, where such of you as are disposed to earn laurels and gain Prize Money, are invited to enter this promising service. *Twenty Dollars Bounty*, and three months advance-pay, will be given, in the outset. Your pay and rations will be liberal; and again you are reminded, that an opportunity is offered for enriching yourselves with prize money. The gallant conquerors on board the *Constitution* have divided 150 Dollars per man. Come, then, there is no time to be lost.
